A series of events unfold at Vigata, an imaginary Sicilian village: in the nighte a fishing boat is shot, apparently in international waters, by a Tunisian un peschereccio viene mitragliato, apparentemente in acque internazionali, da una motovedetta tunisina. A Tunisian sailor is shot on the Italian boat. On the same day Aurelio Lapecora is stabbed in a lift and Karima, a Tunisian cleaning lady, is misteriously missing. Montalbano finds out that the girl used to work for the murdered shop-keeper, she was also his lover and she had a child, François, who is also missing. While going back to the police station from Karima's place, Montalbano sees a group of mothers in front of a primary school : they are complaining about some snack thefts and accusing a young non-European boy. Montalbano realises that they are speaking about François: he manages to take the young child, after lying in wait with Livia, his girfriend, and other policemen. Montalbano and his girlfriend finally decides to host him.

The passage takes place in front of Montalbano's house. François has slept at his place, but when Montalbano wakes up, he doesn't see him, he leans out of the window and he sees him at the beach.
